District A encompasses the highest concentrations of Latinos, where they spend the majority of their time, schools that children attend which include Bobier, VAPA, Vista High School. District B has the West Side of town in addition with school communities of Casita, Maryland, Grapevine and Olive.. Part of the District B contains the second highest population of Latinos and includes St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church. District C includes neighborhoods around Foothill Oak Elementary and Beumont Elementary together.
