I think this map makes sense because . . . District A encompasses the highest concentrations of Latinos, where they spend the majority of their time, schools that children attend which include Bobier, Maryland, VAPA, Vista High School District. District B has the West Side of town in addition to the South Santa Fe corridor. Part of the District B contains the second highest population of Latinos and includes schools like Olive, Casita and Grapevine, in addition to St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church. District C includes neighborhoods around Foothill Oak Elementary and Beumont Elementary together. D encompasses the Breeze Hill Elementary community which is feeder school to Madison Middle School and then Rancho Buena Vista High School, also more connected to the shadowridge community. In addition, highway 78/Breeze Hill Community divide this district into a more connected on commonality of issues.
